SHOULD SOMEONE STILL GET A CDL?

Yes, they should, as many sectors of trucking remain operationally difficult to automate, areas such as:

Specialized freight / Local delivery / Construction transportation / Heavy haul / Hazardous Materials / Agricultural transportation and New Tractor Drive-a-Way Delivery *(this is when 3 to 5 brand new tractors are picked up from a hub or manufacture and delivered to the customer at the same time via several connection protocols), and customer-service-oriented freight operations continue to require skilled professionals.
